He first came from his native town of Brighton to Pittsfield to complete his education at MCI where he graduated in 1891. Later that year he married Georgia and the newly wedded couple moved to St Albans where he was a Teacher at the St Albans Common Schools until 1895 as well as serving as St Albans School Superintendent and Town Clerk.

Georgia is a sister of Wendell D. Annis who married Walter E. M. Seekins' daughter Edna Alice Seekins. Georgia is also a sister of Maude Annis who married Carl F. Randlett and a sister to Mary Annis who married John F. Connelly.

In 1895, he became Principal of Hartland Academy and also served as Superintendent of Hartland Schools in 1897. In 1900, they moved to Newport with their 2 children where he was Principal of Newport High School until health issues forced him to relinquish his teaching career in 1903.

He took a job as a traveling insurance salesman but after a weary year on the road, he and Georgia returned to Hartland with the children. In December of 1904, Elberton purchased the clothing stock and business of the Smith Brothers and opened "E. P. Dyer Clothing" in the building next to Walter E. M. Seekins' store. He continued selling fire insurance from his store and also served several years as Somerset County Treasurer.

On April 15, 1914 fire destroyed Elberton's clothing store. He renovated the building soon after and later reorganized the business with his son-in-law Ralph Edward Nutting as his partner and began operating as the Dyer Clothing Company which Ralph managed.

Soon after 1920, they purchased the former Dr. Lynne Blanchard residence on Blake Street where they were living in C/1930 until they sold it in 1940 to Dr. Paul Briggs.

In 1945, Elberton retired from his clothing business and went to work as Town Manager in Danforth traveling back and forth from Hartland and was working in Danforth when he died. Georgia sold the clothing store building in 1945 to sisters Geraldine (Knowles) Bishop and Meredith (Knowles) Hollister who opened "B & H Market". (See Knowles Family)

Nutting Clothing but following a 1914 fire at his father-in-law's Commercial Street store, Ralph later became his business partner and they began operating as the Dyer Clothing Company which Ralph managed in the 1920s. He also served as Hartland Town Treasurer. They moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota about 1934 where his mother had been born and were living there in C/1940 before eventually returning to Maine.
