On July 11, 1775, he enlisted in Captain John Parker's Company of Colonel Timothy Bedel's Regiment which was raised to take part in Montgomery's invasion of Canada. He signed the Association Test at Weare, New Hampshire on June 6, 1776 and served that year on the Weare Committee of Safety. In December of 1776, he served in the Army of New York and took part in the campaign against General Burgoyne in 1777 serving in Captain Peter Clark's Company of Colonel Daniel Moore's Regiment of New Hampshire Militia." ~ History of Weare, New Hampshire by William Little

He was a Deacon of the Free Will Baptists in New Hampshire and Corinna. They resided in Canaan, New Hampshire before moving to Sandwich, New Hampshire. According to the book "A Brief History of Corinna", they moved to Corinna about 1831 with their sons Joseph, Amos and daughter Hannah and were noted living there in C/1840. Following Moses' death, Bethiah was living with their daughter Hannah Labree and family on the Bean's Corner Road in West Hartland in C/1850.

Note: Spelling of the original family surname as Worthen was used by most of Moses Sr's children however it was changed to Worthing by several of his descendants; most notably in his son Moses Jr's line however both spellings were used by Moses, Jr's children. For purposes of this document, the Worthing surname is used for Moses Worthing Jr's children unless otherwise noted on their interment.

They moved to the Bean's Corner Road in West Hartland shortly before Moses' death near his sister Hannah & James LaBree who were living there by C/1850. Hepsibath was still living there in C/1860 with her sons Ezra, Charles, George & Henry and is noted on the 1860 Map as "Mrs. Worthing". Several of their other children also lived nearby.

Clarendon Joseph Worthen, 84, known throughout Maine as a trotting horseman, died Monday in a local hospital after a brief illness

Born in Corinna, he was the son of Quimby and Nellie (Stevens) Worthen. Before coming to Bangor 35 years ago, he lived in St. Albans. Mr. Worthen was a member of all the masonic bodies, of Corinthian Lodge 95 of Hartland, Anah Temple, Order of the Mystic Shrine, and the Bangor Masonic Club.

Mr. Worthen was well known as a trotting horse owner and a dealer in horses and owned a sales stable in Bangor for many years. He was formerly part owner of Bass Park.

Bigelow Worthen, to whom Mr. Worthen had been married 59 years; a daughter, Mrs. George Mills of Essex Junction, Vt., two brothers, Frank of Guilford and Fred of East Newport; two sisters, Mrs. Flora White of Littletown, Mass., and Mrs. Harry Clark of Stetson; three grandchildren, seven greatgrandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

THE DEATH OF DANA R. WORTHEN

Was Well Known Young Trainer, Driver and Horse Dealer.

Dana R. Worthen, well and most favorably known in this section as a harness race-horse trainer, driver and dealer, died at his home here Saturday after a brief filness of pneumonia, aged 29 years.

He was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarendon J. Worthen, was born and lived in St. Albans until the family came to Bangor about eight years ago. He attended Maine Central Institute and Bliss Commercial College. Brought up among horses, the business of his father, he was a skillful driver before he was out of his 'teens. He made his first appearance in races with his pacer, Billy the Rabbit winning considerable notice as "the boy driver" and usually being "inside the money."

He had appeared on the Maine tracks ever since driving the Worthen string and for other owners. He had a fine reputation as a clever, quiet and well-behaved reinsman, for it was very rarely that a starter was troubled by Dana Worthen. It was not unusual for father and son to drive on the same card although rarely in the same race. He was of a genial disposition and had many friends.

At the time of his death he was president of the Webb & Worthen Co. Inc., horse dealers.

He was a member of the Knights of Pythias of Hartland. Surviving are his wife, M. Lois Worthen and a daughter, Mary Ellen. A sister, Mrs. George Mills, lives in Essex Junction, Vt.

Funeral services will be at the residence, 96 Forest avenue at 16 a.m., DST, Tuesday. Interment will be in the village cemetery, St. Albans, at 1 p. m. Tuesday.
