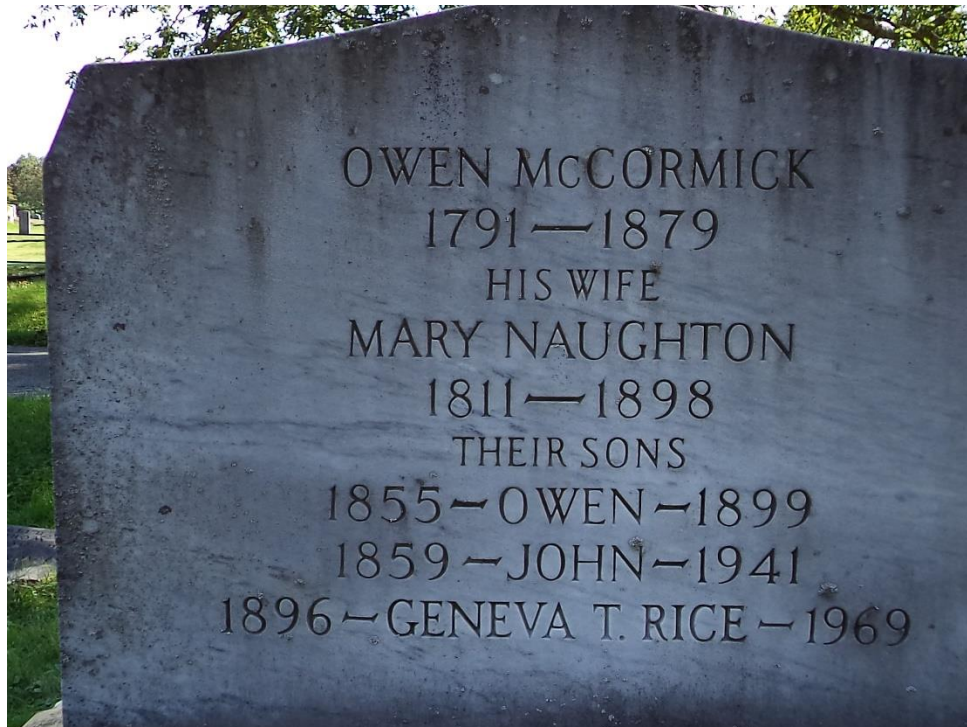

Owen married first to Catherine in Ireland where they had at least 3 sons, Thomas, Patrick & Lawrence. She is noted on their son Lawrence & Patrick's death certificate as their mother and Owen noted as their father. It is unclear whether Catherine passed away or they divorced but she did not come to the states.

Owen immigrated to Maine in 1849 and became a Naturalized Citizen in 1856 while living in what was then Frankfort. He was living there in C/1860 (noted as Owen Norton) with his family next to Daniel McCormack (either his brother or cousin) who had also come to Frankfort in 1847. Frankfort was first settled in 1766 and included what is now Winterport. On March 12 1860, Winterport incorporated as a separate town. In C/1870 he was listed with Mary and their 4 known children in Winterport noted as a Laborer. Mary is shown as widowed in C/1880 still living in Winterport. He gives various ages to the Census Takers so his exact birth year remains questionable between 1791 & 1797.

Various documents throughout the decades including Census Reports, birth, death & marriage certificates and gravestones, show the spelling of the family surname varying between "McCormick" & McCormack" even between siblings.

In C/1900, Sarah E. McCormack was listed in the household of 81yr old Abby Rockwood in Boston at 31yrs old as a Servant. She was still livin in the Rockwood household in C/1910 noted as 41yrs old as a Housekeeper when Abby was 91yrs old. Sarah was noted born in Maine and both her parents born in Ireland on each report. She was living in Winterport in C/1940 at 72yrs old living with her sister Mae.

They were living in Auburn in C/1920 where he was a Foreman at a Creamery and remained in Auburn in C/1930 & C/1940. It appears they moved to Rhode Island soon after to join one of their children.

He enlisted in the Army on 2 Oct 1917 in Auburn. He was overseas from 16 July 1918 to 26 April 1919. Honorable Discharge upon demobilization on 1 May 1919. He registered for the WWII Draft at 48yrs old while he was living in Cranston, Rhode Island and at the time working for the Cranston Print Works.

B) Sarah Alice McCormack "Alice"

She was living with her parents at 32yrs old in Auburn in C/1930 working as a Telephone Operator.

He was living in Kittery when he signed up for the WWI Draft at 20yrs old in September of 1918 working as a machinist in Portsmouth, N.H. In 1936, he was living in Cranston, Rhode Island, single, working as Framer in a Cotton Textile Mill.

In C/1880, Frank was listed at 2yrs old with his parents in Winterport. In C/1900, he was living in Winterport noted as 20yrs old in the household of Henry Bolan where his was noted as a servant. It is unclear where he was living in C/1910 but his obituary notes he was a resident of Hartland for 40 years (1915). At the time of their marriage, Elsie was living in St Albans and noted working for a skirt factory while Frank was living in Hartland and was the Manager of the D. Whiting & Son Creamery on Elm Street (which became the Hartland Co-Operative Creamery Inc. by 1923). In C/1920 they were living on Pleasant Street and Frank still worked for the creamery. They were still living on Pleasant Street in C/1930 where he was working for the American Woolen Mill in Hartland. He then worked as a Night Watchman for over 20 years at the H. C. Baxter Canning Company in Hartland as noted in C/1940. Her sister Etta Bennett married Harold E. Baird (See Baird Family)

~ McGray & Bennett Family Notes ~

Sabiah (McGray) Bennett and her twin sister Mariah (who married Gene Richards) were born in Bradford on 22 June 1869; two of the 8 children of Ezra McGray & Emily Lewis.

Ezra Isreal McGray was born in Harmony on 4 Apr 1837, the son of Methodist Reverend Nathan Woodman Chase McGray & Elizabeth P. Bradstreet. Ezra enlisted in the Civil War as a Private with the 1st Maine Heavy Artillery Regiment, Company B on 7 Dec 1863. He was promoted to Full Corporal on 9 May 1864 and was mustered out on 23 July 1864. He was also noted as wounded in the war. He died 29 July 1899 in Bridgewater and is believed to be interred at Boundary Cemetery in Bridgewater with their son Eugene.

Emily Crowell Lewis first married in 1851 to Noyes C. Scott in Lowell, Massachusetts. Her birth date of Jan 1832 and parents' names match for the most part although she lists Hartland as her birth town instead of China and Hannah as her mother who was actually her Step-Mother. Her 14 June 1915 death certificate notes her father as Richard Lewis and her mother as "Zubie" Harding (aka Azubah). Emily's brother George W. Lewis remained in Hartland and is the father of Preston Lewis. (See Lewis Family) Emily was living in Hartland at 18yrs old with her father, step-mother & siblings in C/1850 after they had recently moved from China, Maine. Noyes died in 1855 and it appears they had no children.

Emily returned to Maine and married Ezra McGray around 1857. In C/1860 they were living in Bangor with their 1yr old son Frank before moving to Bradford by 1865. A son born in 1861 died in Bradford in 1865 and is interred at the Mills Cemetery in Bradford as "McGray E____, (stone broken), son of E--- and Emily C. McGray, died Aug 31, 1865 at 4 years, 3 months, and 17 days"

The McGray Family moved from Bradford to Bridgewater soon after C/1880 where Sabiah met and married Sander Bennett on 29 Mar 1889 in Fort Fairfield. Sabiah & Sander had 3 children but only Etta (b. 1892) & Elsie (b. 1896) survived past infancy. They had separated and divorced by 1900.

Sander L. Bennett was born 22 Mar 1868 in Linneus, son of Ruel Bennett & Julia Sawyer. He remarried Alice Drake on 29 Oct 1900 and died 29 May 1920 at 52yrs old. He is interred at Webster Cemetery in Limestone with his parents. Ruel is the son of George Allen Bennett and Sarah Allen. George died in the Civil War at 60yrs old at Camp Parapet, Louisiana on 13 Aug 1862. Ruel's brother Charles also died in

the Civil War on 30 Jan 1861 at Brandy Station, Culpepper County, Virginia. His brother John Hall Bennett also served as a Sergeant with the 15th Maine Infantry, Company E but survived the war. George & Charles are interred at Linneus Cemetery. Sarah (Allen) Bennett (b.1804) eventually moved to Iowa living with her son John in C/1880 where she died soon after on 11 Nov 1880 (aged 75) and is buried at the New Hampton Cemetery in New Hampton, Chickasaw County, Iowa.

Sabiah moved to the Hartland area sometime after she and Sander divorced possibly living with her sister Nellie McGray who had married Fred Palmer in 1901 and had moved to St Albans at the future Gee Farm. Although it is still unclear where she was living in C/1900, Sabiah died in Hartland at 34yrs old on 21 Mar 1904 of cancer and is interred at Pine Grove Cemetery with Nellie & Fred and her mother Emily. It is also unclear where Elsie was living in C/1900 but she was living with her Uncle Frank & Aunt Nellie (McGray) Palmer in St Albans in C/1910 until she married Frank in 1919.

*Etta had remained in Fort Fairfield living with her paternal grandparents Ruel & Julia Bennett in C/1900 at 8yrs old. Etta was living in the home of Stuart & Myra Goodwin in St Albans at 18yrs old in C/1910 noted as a "Hired Girl" and was also noted as a resident of St Albans when she married Harold Baird in 1912. (See **Baird Family**)*

Following Ezra's death in 1899, Emily moved to Pittsfield and was living with her nephew Oscar Lewis in C/1900 noted as Emeline C. Bennett and listed as a Maid. She noted 8 children born, 5 living at the time. It is unclear where she was living in C/1910 but her death certificate notes her residence as St Albans.
