They had no known children.

Their names (only) and marriage intention date are noted on a "Copy of an Old Record". It has been suggested but unconfirmed by several ancestral researchers that Elizabeth Nevens was an older sister of Sarah Nevens, his 2nd wife.

They were noted in Pejepscot in C/1810 before moving to West Hartland shortly after where they built their homestead on the Morrill Pond Road just west of Fullers Corner. Amos signed the 1819 petition for Hartland to incorporate as a town in 1820 and they were noted living there with their children in C/1820, C/1830 & C/1840. In C/1850, Amos was still Head of Household of the homestead with their youngest son Stafford living with them while their son Amos Tucker, Jr was living across the road from them. Stafford took over the West Hartland homestead by C/1860 with his parents, at 80yrs old & 75yrs old respectively, living with him and his young family. Amos was still living with Stafford in West Hartland in C/1870 noted at 91yrs old and widowed. It remains unknown if he died in Hartland or left with Stafford for Smithfield and died there.

They built their house in West Hartland across from his father's lot on the Morrill Pond Road. An August 13, 1891 newspaper article noted, "Mr. Amos Tucker is very low and failing fast." At the time of his 2nd wife Lydia's death in 1895, she was noted as a Widow on her death certificate.

According to a short biography of their son James from 1924 of local people in Placer County, California, Amos moved to California shortly after Louisa's death in 1853 then returned to his homestead in West Hartland by 1859 where he married his 2nd wife Lydia Mitchell.

James' bio also notes his father died at 80 years old and had 4 (surviving) children from a previous marriage listed as Calvin, Roxinda, Annie and Jane. Calvin's 1903 obituary notes 4 surviving sisters including Mrs. Hattie Buzzell of Hartland with the 3 others listed only as Mrs. B. W. Dodge of Horton, Kansas, Mrs. A. M. Rolfe of Pittsfield and Mrs. J. L. Chase of Shirley Center, Massachusetts.

Living in West Hartland with her parents in C/1850 and with her father and step-mother in C/1860 noted as Roxinda Elizabeth Tucker.

"Elizabeth R. Tucker was born March 17, 1843 at Hartland, Maine, and died at her home northwest of Everest on October 23, 1939. She was married on March 17, 1869 at Cornville, Maine to Benjamin Wiley Dodge. They came to Kansas in 1870 and settled near Hiawatha. Two children were born to them, Ernest L., now living near Willis, and Clarence Ray, who died in infancy. Mr. Dodge died December 5, 1903 on a farm near Willis. She was married to Owen Jones of Everest on September 21, 1904 and lived at Everest until his death in February 2, 1914. She then moved to Horton, where she made her home until she was 90 years old, when she went to live with her son." - Find-A-Grave

Living in West Hartland with her parents in C/1850 and with her father and step-mother in C/1860 noted in both as Mary Ann Tucker, b.1845. Her obituary notes she had been born in Hartland 85yrs ago and married 60yrs ago. They resided in Pittsfield after they married for most of their lives but in their later years sold their farm and moved to Burnham Village around 1922. They both fell seriously ill at the same time and he was reported in her obituary in grave condition at the time and passed away soon after.

James Tucker moved from West Hartland to California in the spring of 1878 at 18 years old where he was a boarder in the house next to his Uncle James Mitchell's farm in C/1880. After they married, he and Nellie raised 5 sons and a daughter and he became a prominent rancher in Lincoln.

Stafford took over his parents West Hartland homestead by C/1860 with his parents, at 80 & 75yrs old respectively, living with him and his family. His father Amos was still living with Stafford in West Hartland in C/1870 noted at 91yrs old and widowed. Stafford and Lizzie divorced in September of 1876 and he moved to Smithfield by C/1880 living in the household of Abel Cole Merrill, a step-son of his sister Lovicy. Stafford sold his father's homestead to Smith Flanders (1830-1903) who was living there in 1883. Smith moved to Monmouth following his wife Mary's death in 1890 (Black Stream Cemetery) and remarried to Rhoda A. Titus in 1897. The original homestead settled by Amos Tucker, Sr was eventually purchased by Melvin Ford.
