Nineteen miles east of Skowhegan on the Sebasticook River. Terminus of Sebasticook & Moosehead Rail Road. Stage Coach to St Albans daily. Settled about 1802. Organized as a Plantation on [October 11, 1819](#). Incorporated as 235th Town on [February 7, 1820](#).
