His September 1751 Baptism is recorded in Salisbury, Massachusetts Vital Records as Edward Hall Page, son of Solomon Page. Their family record listed in Bath Vital Records notes their names, birth dates, marriage date and their children's names, birth and known death dates (See bottom for original record). They were listed living in Bath in C/1790, C/1800, C/1810 and C/1820 noted as the household of Edward H. Page. His service record and portions of his family lineage were recorded in his Great-Grandson Walter E. Page's 1915 application for the Colorado Society of the Sons of American Revolution Membership. Bath was part of Georgetown when it incorporated in 1753 before it was set off and incorporated as a separate town on February 17, 1781.

He was noted as "Edward Hull Page of Bath" and she as "Clarissa Colman of Newburyport" on the record of their marriage. Several variations of her name are found on other records of their children including Maria Coleman on their son William's marriage record. She was only noted as "unknown mother" born in Bath on their son John's death certificate. No records have been found to confirm her presumed death.

Edward served as Sergeant with Captain Nathaniel Sprague's Artillery raised in Bath serving from June 20, 1814 through September 29, 1814. They were living in Bath in C/1810 & C/1820 listed separately as the household of Edward H. Page, Jr living near his parents.

He remarried in Bath to Ruth Witham in 1826 (see below) and they moved from Bath to Windsor living there by C/1830 where their daughter Hannah was born in 1832. In 1837, Edward and his son John purchased the first tannery originally built in Hartland in 1828 by brothers Hiram & Thomas Dorman located on the lower side of the Main Street bridge and moved his family to St Albans (likely the part of St Albans which became Hartland in 1849) living there in C/1840. Edward had retired from the tannery business by C/1850 when he was noted as a farmer at 70yrs old living in Hartland with Ruth and daughters Sarah & Hannah.

No records have been found to clarify his place of residence in C/1830 but their marriage recorded in Bath Vital Records as John Page and Rachel Collar note they were both residing in Bath at the time. Spelling of her maiden name as Collier is found on other records of their children.

Following the purchase of the former Dorman Brothers Tannery in Hartland with his father in 1837, they moved there soon after. They were living in Hartland listed in C/1840 as the household of John Page enumerated with 1 male under 5 (presumed son John S., infant), 1 male 30-40 (presumed John at 35yrs), 2 females under 5 (presumed daughters Wealthy at 4yrs & Emily at 2yrs), 1 female 5-10 (presumed daughter Almira at 6yrs) and 1 female 20-30 (presumed wife Rachel at 29yrs).

By C/1850, John had taken over the family tannery business and was later joined by his son John S. Page operating as John Page & Son Tanning Company. He & Rachel remained in Hartland where he was noted as Head of Household from C/1860 through C/1880 at their homestead on the corner of Main Street and Pittsfield Avenue. The tannery was severely damaged in the Flood of 1887 and eventually replaced by the new building addition of the Linn Woolen Mill in 1890. They were still residing at their homestead at the time of their respective deaths after which their son John S. Page and his wife took over the home.

Their sprawling homestead included a set of outbuildings and a large barn running along the banks of the Seabaticook River as seen in photos and maps from 1860, 1883 & 1917. The homestead was sold in 1932 likely following John S. Page's death and used as a residence. It was sold again in 1936 and the outbuildings and barn were torn down and the main house was converted into a full service gas station.

No records have been found to confirm her birth place but she was likely born in Bath before her father purchased the tannery in Hartland in 1837. She was living with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 before she married.

Peleg studied at Colby College then graduated from the Medical School of Maine in Portland in 1856. He began his practice in Hartland on Main Street at the future Harrington Block before they moved to Stockton Springs in 1860. Following Almira's death, he remarried to Sarah A. Blanchard in 1867. In 1879 they moved to St. Paul, Minnesota with their 2 surviving children, Blanche & Sprague Fogg Haskell, where he continued his practice until his death.

She was living in Stockton Springs in C/1870 with her father and step-mother but moved back to Hartland when they moved to Minneapolis and was living with her grandparents John & Rachel Page in C/1880. Archibald was living with her younger brother Edward in Guilford in C/1880. They had both moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota by 1887 where they married and were living in C/1900 where Archie operated a hardware store. By C/1920, they had moved to Seattle, Washington along with her Aunt Wealthy Page. She and Archie were still living in Seattle in C/1930 and were living with their daughter Marion and son-in-law Samuel Vigus in Seattle in C/1940.

She never married.

No records have been found to confirm her birth place but she was likely born in Bath before her father purchased the tannery in Hartland in 1837. She was still living with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 thru C/1870.

She was living in Guilford in C/1880 with her brother Edward H. Page III along with her sister Almira's future husband Archibald Gee. She moved to Minneapolis by C/1900 living with her niece Lucia (Haskell) Gee and family. She was still living with them in Minneapolis before moving with them to Seattle, Washington by C/1920.

Several records and references indicate she was born in Hartland soon after her parents moved there. She was still living with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 & C/1860 before she married.

They lived in Hartland in C/1870 after they married where all 5 of their children were born before moving to Skowhegan in 1875 with their 4 surviving children. Luther was a teacher in his younger years then turned to a political career as a Representative in the Maine State Legislature in 1868 then a Maine State Senator in 1869-1870. He then served from 1874 to 1890 as Clerk of Courts for Somerset County before his declining health led them to move to

Pasadena, California in 1893. Emily wrote throughout her life as noted below in an article published before they moved to California. She had many poems published under the name Emily Page Webb.

“Emily Page Webb was born in Hartland, a small manufacturing town on the Sebasticook River, about 1838. Her father's house commanded a fine view of the country and the river where it leaped the falls, and dashed its white current against the rocky islands. No white hand of winter ever stilled its murmurs, and no hot breath of summer ever drank up its sparkling freshness. The broad, low hills on the north and west, and a dark green line of forest on the east seemed to encircle this little town with a magic charm, while far away to the south, the silver line of the river rolled its way through the meadows. Here, amid this quiet beauty, Emily spent her childhood and youth. Her love of poetry and talent of expressing herself in verse showed itself before she was ten years of age. Equally strong was her loving desire to assist her mother; picture to yourself a light little girl, with laughing blue eyes and rosy cheeks, working before school in the kitchen, and, at the same time, putting her fancies into words. In later years, no household work ever seemed to interfere with the sweet songs she had to sing. When she was old enough to attend the St. Albans Academy her poetic power was soon discovered, and she was called upon to write for the lyceum papers, for festivals or any public occasion where wit and sentiment were required. In October, 1861, she was married to Mr. Luther H. Webb, her schoolmate and lover from early youth. The first years of their married life were spent in Hartland, but in 1875 they removed to Skowhegan, where they still live. She is the mother of five children, two girls and three boys. Nina, her first child, died in early infancy. Her domestic life has been a happy one, where parents and children are congenial spirits, united in aim, intellect and taste. When the Woman's Club was organized in Skowhegan, she joined and was made secretary, where the wit and brilliancy of her reports gave her a high standing in public favor. Since then, she has been president of the Club, and “poet laureate” of every public occasion. Her noble womanhood, her tender regard for the feelings of others, her insight and tact in dealing with those around her, portray a character of rare beauty that gives added charm to her verse.”

He remained in Maine and after graduating high school in Skowhegan, attended the University of Maine at Orono graduating at the top of his class in 1887. He did his graduate work at Cornell and the University of Wisconsin before eventually returning to UMO in 1898 to become head of the newly formed Electrical Engineering Department. He was a patient being treated for TB at the Hebron Sanitarium at the time of his death.

III. Elmira Frances Webb

d. 22 Apr 1929 Pasadena, California

She never married.

She moved to California with her parents and was living with her mother in Pasadena from C/1900 to C/1920. She is listed with several spelling variations of her name on different census reports and records as Clairra or Mida.

He remained in Maine and resided in Bangor in C/1900 after they married where he worked for the Bangor Daily News until they moved to California by 1920.

He moved to California with his parents where he married and remained the rest of his life.

They had no known children.

He grew up at his father's homestead on the corner of Main Street & Pittsfield Avenue and lived there throughout his life with both his wives and his son. He likely worked at his father's tannery as a young man and later became a partner in the business operating as John Page & Son Tannery. After the tannery closed following the 1887 flood, he operated a wood mill on Pittsfield Avenue next to the railroad tracks.

He & Sarah took over his father's homestead following his father's death in 1898 and were living there in C/1900, C/1910 and C/1920. John was noted as Sarah's surviving husband in her death notice. No further records of his residence in C/1930 or his death or burial have been found however the family homestead was sold in 1932 presumably after his death.

He graduated from Hartland Academy Class of 1908. He was living with his parents in Hartland in C/1900 & C/1910 before he moved to Newark, New Jersey by 1917 where he registered for the WWI Draft. He was an Engineer for the New York & New Haven Railroad when he suddenly took ill and died.

She was living with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 & C/1860 and in C/1870 at 27yrs old. She was not mentioned as a surviving sibling in her brother Edward's 1904 obituary.

d. 29 June 1931 Pasadena, California (IC w/parents) at 86yrs

She never married.

She lived with her parents in Hartland through C/1880. She moved to Pasadena and was living with her widowed sister Emily Page Webb in C/1900 through C/1920. Following Emily's death, she remained in Pasadena living there in C/1930 at 85yrs old. Following her death, her remains were returned to Hartland for burial at Ireland Cemetery with her parents.

They had no known children.

He moved from Hartland to Guilford about 1874 and was living there in C/1880 where his sister Wealthy was living with him as well as his niece Lucia Haskell's future husband Archibald Gee. He was living in Guilford where he was a successful businessman and owned several properties at the time of his death at Eastern Maine General Hospital in Bangor.

In 1867, he moved to Nebraska with some of their children as one of the early settlers of Syracuse where he remarried.

Following both their deaths in 1855, she lived with her brother John and his family in Hartland as noted in C/1860, C/1870 and again in C/1880 noted throughout each Census as "idiot & insane".

Their marriage was recorded in Bath Vital Records noting the marriage of "Mr. Edward H. Page & Miss Ruth Witham" both of Bath. She passed away just a couple weeks before Edward's death.

She is noted in Windsor Vital Records with her birth date as "Hannah Elizabeth Page, daughter of Edward H. Page and his wife Ruth" who were living there in C/1830. Presumed to be the "Female 5 thru 9" enumerated with her parents in St Albans in C/1840 and noted by name with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 as Hannah E. Page at 18yrs old.

Circumstantial evidence suggests she may have moved to Missouri where she married as Elizabeth Page and remained the rest of her life. The birth date engraved on her possible gravestone with her husband as "H. Elizabeth" matches her name and known birth date but no records with her parent's names or her specific town of birth have been found except being noted she was born in Maine in various records. This possible timeline is noted below in the event further detailed records are discovered to confirm.
