Much of the information concerning birth dates, marriage dates, death dates, and the locations where those events occurred for the 1st four generations of the Huff Family varies greatly from several research sources. Those details, as noted below, are for reference purposes intended to provide a general background for their descendants who later settled in Hartland and are subject to confirmation.

The towns known today as Kennebunkport and Arundel were originally occupied by Native Abenaki people when English Captain Bartholomew Gosnold and other Europeans first made contact in 1602. It was later named Cape Porpoise by English Captain John Smith in 1614 during his early explorations of the region. English fishermen began making seasonal residences in the area beginning about 1619 until a year-round European settlement was established in 1629 based on a land grant from the Plymouth Colony and was incorporated as "Cape Porpus" under the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1653.

In 1689, during King William's War (1688-1697), Natives forced the settlers off until resettlement of the area began around 1699. In 1701, Cape Porpoise was renamed as Arundel, however in 1703 Natives again drove settlers away during Queen Anne's War until their return in about 1714. Further attacks against settlers were made from 1723-1727 and active hostilities only stopped when France, the Natives' military ally, ceded Southern Maine to England after King George's War (1744-1748).

In 1821, the town of Arundel was renamed as Kennebunkport which included Cape Porpoise and Arundel as villages within its municipality. Arundel remained a part of Kennebunkport until 1915 when it was set off and named North Kennebunkport until 1957 when it was renamed back to Arundel. ~ Compiled from various Wikipedia articles

They moved to Cape Porpoise by at least 1672 where he was elected Selectman on December 7, 1672. He bought half of Batson's Neck in Cape Porpoise in 1674. He was the Proprietor of an Inn/Public House in Cape Porpoise in 1674 but moved back to Portsmouth by June of 1678. They returned to Cape Porpoise by 1682 where he was noted again as Proprietor of a Public House until the town was abandoned in 1689 during King William's War. In 1693, he was living in Portsmouth and is last found taxed at Little Harbor (part of Portsmouth) in May of 1701. Mary's death date is unknown and the last known record of her is an October 16, 1681 document she signed while they were living in Portsmouth. ~ Compiled from "Descendants of Ferdinando Huff/Hough"

*"He resided on Great Island (NH) during the time this town (Arundel) was deserted (1689-1699). He came back in 1700 but was again forced to flee in 1703." They were living in Spruce Creek (part of Kittery) in 1708-09. They returned to Arundel again about 1714 after Grace's parents deeded to them the Ferris homestead in Arundel and one-fourth interest in a sloop in return for life support until their deaths. In 1719 he was Constable of the town. "Mr. Huff's sons were, George, **Thomas**, James, Charles, John, who died young, and Joseph, who Mr. Hovey says was drowned in Batson's River on Sept. 30, 1749. His daughters were Sarah, who married John Hamer and Mary who married Miles Rhodes." ~ Compiled from History of Kennebunkport*

By 1810, they had moved from Arundel to Hartland, known then as Township No. 3 in the 1st Range north of the Plymouth Claim and settled at what became known as Huff Hill. It appears they came with their younger sons James and Moses and an unknown daughter as noted in the 1810 Census below. Their oldest son Benjamin also moved to Hartland and was noted separately as Head of Household on the 1810 Census living next to them.

In a June 9, 1810 deed, Thomas purchased a lot from Dr. John Warren for \$100 described in the deed as, "One hundred acres of land off the south end of Lot No. 4 in the 3rd Range of Lots in Township No. 3 in the first range north of the Kennebec Survey in the District of Maine of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts." Given that Thomas was noted as a resident of Township No. 3 in the deed, it is unclear if this was the lot they had already settled on or an additional lot purchase.

Thomas and his 3 sons were still living at Huff Hill in C/1820 with each listed separately as Head of Household with their families. Thomas and his 3 sons signed the 1819 petition for Hartland to incorporate as a town.

A May 30, 1844 newspaper death notices article included, "In Hartland, a few days since, Mr. Thomas Huff, aged one hundred and eight years." A 1946 article from the Pittsfield Advertiser in the Hartland

news section entitled 'The Backward Look' notes, "Among the early settlers of Hartland were Thomas Huff (III) who settled at Huff Hill. Thomas was a Revolutionary soldier and is said to have lived to be 108 years old."

Although it is impossible to confirm with absolute certainty this is the same Thomas Huff III, these records match his known residence at the time as well as various related references of his service.

Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the War of the Revolution; Volume 8, Page 466:

Huff, Thomas; Arundel (also given as Thomas Huff, Jr), Private, Capt. John Elden's co., Col. Lemuel Robinson's regt.; pay abstract for mileage, dated Roxbury, Feb. 26, 1776; mileage (110 miles) allowed said Huff.

also, company receipt given to Capt. John Elden, for travelling expenses to camp and home, dated Dorchester, April 1, 1776.

also, Private, in a company commanded by Lieut. Daniel Wheelwright; pay abstract for billeting, etc.; mileage (125 miles) allowed said Huff; warrant allowed in Council Aug. 19, 1776.

also, Capt. John Wentworth's co., Col. Aaron Willard's regt.; pay abstract for travel allowance from home to Bennington, dated Boston, Jan. 6, 1777; 302 miles travel allowed said Huff.

also, Same co. and regt.; pay abstract for travel allowance, etc., home, from place of discharge, Fort Edward, dated Boston, Jan. 15, 1777; 392 miles travel allowed said Huff.
