

They moved to Harris Hill in Canaan by 1818 then to West Hartland by 1827 where they settled at their future namesake Chase Hill before it became part of Canaan in 1849 where he operated his farm and a sawmill. The Norridgewock to Bangor Stage Coach Route passed through next to their farm on the old County Road. They moved to Cornville after 1870 to live with their daughter Elvira (Chase) Moody until their respective deaths. He served in Waterville in Captain Isaac Holt's Company raised in Canaan on September 14, 1814 as part of Lt. Colonel James Waugh's Regiment of the Massachusetts Militia to protect against a possible invasion by the British. Lucy's family lineage ties directly back to the Mayflower's John Alden and Priscilla Mullens via her Great Grandfather John Burrill II who married their granddaughter Mercy Alden. Following his service in the Revolutionary War, Lucy's father Benoni Burrill moved his family to Canaan around 1802 living next to his brother Humphrey Burrill's lot.

OBITUARY.

1818—Benjamin Chase—1907.

Benjamin Chase, eldest son of Benjamin and Lucy (Burrill) Chase was born in a log cabin May 13, 1818, in the town of Canaan, Maine, then the state of Massachusetts, on what is known as "Harris" hill. At the age of nine years his parents moved onto another hill farm in the town of Hartland, now Canaan, and which still bears the name of "Chase" hill.

Of this pioneer family of seven children, Elvira Moody settled in Cornville, Benjamin, Cyrus, Amos, Ripley, Johnathan H. and Richard G. made their homes in Canaan, while Almada, wife of Oakman S. Abell, resided in Bowdoin, Maine. All with one exception, Ripley Chase of Canaan, have passed to the beyond. Benjamin, being the eldest son, had many a hard task to perform in those early days. When but a mere lad he was sent on horseback through the wilderness on many and various errands in all conditions of weather, often going to Skowhegan, or Milburn as it was then called, with a bag of corn to mill, or a horse to be shod, and many an interesting story has he related of those early days, such as helping to drive the bears from the cornfields at night with fire brands, and going to Bangor and Ellsworth with an ox team with farm produce to market. In his youth he had many experiences which boys of today know little about, all of which went to make up the stardiness of his character which was woven into the very warp and woof of his life and made him staunch and true to the end. Every young man struggling to win his way upward always had his sympathy and assistance if needed.

At the age of 22 years Mr Chase was first married to Miss Lovina Connor of Skowhegan and settled on a small farm adjoining his father's. But his ambitious nature could not long remain and toil on land so unremunerative and hard to till, and with many protestations of failure from his parents he sold out and bought the valley farm at Brown's Corner, then nearly all forest. He built all the buildings on the place, developed and made additions to the farm which was his home for 37 years, making it one of the finest and most profitable in the country. Five children were born to them, Mrs. Annie M. Drew who died in Woodside, California, Oct. 23, 1866, Charles B., a soldier of the Civil War who received a fatal wound at the battle at Antietam and died Oct. 22, 1862, Mrs. Jennie M. Whitney of Valley Mills, Texas, Liola W. Chase of Cleburne, Texas, and Mrs. Lucie E. Crowell of Pittsfield.

The wife and mother passed away June 20, 1874, and later Mr. Chase was united in marriage to Mrs. Adaline B. Crowell of Canaan. After a few years Mr. and Mrs. Chase went to live in Canaan village where they enjoyed the comforts of a good home until the weight of declining years made a change necessary to insure the tender care which would be given by their son and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Isaiah Crowell, in their home in Pittsfield where they moved in Oct., 1904, and where Mrs. Chase passed away on Dec. 13, 1906.

One year ago Mr. Chase was able to gratify a long cherished desire to visit again his children and grandchildren in Texas and his daughter, Mrs. Crowell, accompanied him thither. Four months were very pleasantly spent in that sunny land. An accident, greatly deplored by his friends, occurred while riding and from which he never fully recovered, but he never regretted going. Five grandchildren and one great grandchild live to bless his memory.

Mr. Chase was a Republican and held town offices in Canaan. He was an honored member of Carrabassett Lodge of F. and A. M., and was chaplain for several years; a life long Universalist which faith he enjoyed to the end which came on Jan. 27, 1907, as a sequel to a stroke of paralysis on Jan. 17.

Rev. F. A. Taylor, pastor of the First Universalist church of Pittsfield, conducted prayers at his late home on Somerset avenue on Tuesday, Jan. 29, at 10 a.m., and at the final service at the church in Canaan at 2 p. m., he spoke words of comfort to the large gathering of relatives and friends. The sad but beautiful Masonic ceremony was performed in the church by a large delegation of that order. The bearers were Masonic brethren, Richard Harris, Chas. Harris, George Smith, George Barrett and the remains were placed in the receiving tomb awaiting interment in the family lot. "Lead Kindly Light," "Abide with Me," and "Jesus Lover of My Soul" were beautifully rendered in song by Mrs. Chas. Harris and Mrs. George Weeks.

He enlisted in Canaan on December 10, 1861. On September 17, 1862 at The Battle of Antietam in Maryland, he was shot in the shoulder then while attempting to retreat, he was shot again severely wounding his left ankle. He was taken to a military hospital in Alexandria where his leg was amputated but died about a month later from infection. He was noted in this 1900 memorial as the 1st soldier from Canaan to die in the war.

Monday, Sept. 17 was the anniversary of the battle of Antietam, Md., thirty eight years ago, a hard fought battle in which the gallant Seventh Maine participated with such direful results. One of Canaan's brave young men, Chas. B. Chase, a member of Co B, received wounds in this engagement from which he died a month later. The color bearer had been shot down and a volunteer was called for to take his place. Many hesitated, then this brave lad, just nineteen years old the day before, stepped forth and raised the flag, and bore it through the next charge, in which he received a wound in the left shoulder. Still up holding his country's flag, he was forced to retreat with the rest, and while doing so he received a bullet in his ankle which caused him to fall upon the battle field where he laid among his wounded comrades until carried to a barn and from thence to the hospital at Alexandria where his leg was amputated. His wounds were serious ones, and although cared for as well as could be under the circumstances, by hospital nurses and a kind father, he died of pyaemia, Oct. 30, 1862. His remains were embalmed and brought home by his father, Benjamin Chase, and buried in the cemetery at this place. He was the first from this town to fall in defence of his country. His burial was under military escort. Having been a member before his enlistment of Canaan Home Guards, that company attended in a body. The funeral was very largely attended. The late Rev. Willard Carr, of East Skowhegan, conducted the services. Thirty years after, his remains were disinterred and found to be in a most perfect state of preservation. They were removed to the village cemetery interred in a new family lot, where each springtime his grave is decorated with flowers and the flag he so bravely died to defend, waves peacefully above his lowly bed.

Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin Chase of Canaan have recently come to Pittsfield to spend the winter with their son and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. [Isaiah Crowell](#), on Somerset avenue. Both are well preserved old people and are able to perform some work every day. Having led sober, industrious lives, they enjoy in old age the blessings of good health. Mrs. Chase at 83 is smart and spry as a girl and assists in the household duties. Mr. Chase in his 87th year is still quite active and does many chores every day. He takes the daily Kennebec Journal and is much interested in the events of the day and often reads it without the aid of glasses. He cast his first vote for President for William Henry Harrison in 1840 and has voted at every State and Presidential election since. On Nov. 8, he rode to Canaan, a distance of eleven miles, to vote for Theodore Roosevelt and Charles W. Fairbanks. Every faculty seems to be alert except his hearing which is getting somewhat defective.

Obituary.

After an illness of nineteen weeks caused by a stroke of paralysis, during which time he was tenderly cared for by his aged wife and children, Mr. Cyrus Chase of Canaan, aged eighty years, passed to the life beyond on Wednesday, August 28, at the family home of William Jewell. Mr. Chase was the second son of the late Benjamin and Lucy Chase, pioneers of that town. Of their family of eight children "Uncle Cyrus" was the sixth to die. Two brothers, Benjamin and Ripley Chase survive him, his aged wife, one son Cyrus Jr. of Jamaica Plain Mass., and two daughters, Mrs. Sarah Jewell with whom the aged couple have lived for many years, and Mrs. Carrie Rolfo of Pittsfield are the immediate relatives to mourn his death. His familiar form will be missed by the neighbors whom he loved to associate with. His long life has been a quiet uneventful one, and has been passed since his marriage to Miss Thankful Woodbury of Hartland, on the farm on which they settled three score years ago, and under the shadow of Chase hill where he was born. For many years he was a firm believer in the Advent doctrine, but of late years he embraced more liberal views which sustained him in his long illness and he waited with joy for the release from his terrible sufferings. Funeral services occurred on Friday afternoon at the schoolhouse, Rev. O. M. Chase, a nephew, officiating.



September 21, 1853 and was educated in the schools of Canaan, later becoming a teacher. For about four years the couple lived on the Crowell farm some one and one-half miles from Canaan village. They sold this farm in 1875 to a neighbor, E. H. Elliott and went to the home of Mrs. Crowell's father, Benjamin Chase, at Brown's Corner where they lived until January 1904. Having sold their farm they moved to Canaan village where they remained until October when they went to Pittsfield and engaged in lumbering and mill business. After four years of residence in that village where both were prominently identified with the Pittsfield Grange and Mrs. Crowell the Pittsfield Tuesday Club, they went to the town of Monroe and lived on a farm nine years. After selling this property they came to Skowhegan and purchased the

and comfortable. Its location is a charming one, setting at something of an elevation east on a hill from the little Malbon's Mills village. The main part of the house must be more than a century old. Within its walls are firm old pine planks fully three inches thick. The north and south parlors have old fashioned finish and the windows are equipped with old time shutters such as but few houses in this section possess. From the window beautiful views are obtainable, especially from the north room where not far away, unite two streams one the outlet from Lake Wesserunett and the other the Wesserunett river flowing down from Athens. The waters here form a tiny bay where pond lilies grow in summer weather and where Mr. and Mrs. Crowell have a boat and keenly enjoy the quiet of their rural surroundings.

Transcription of Benjamin Chase, Jr Obituary - 1907

Benjamin Chase, eldest son of Benjamin and Lucy (Burrill) Chase was born in a log cabin on May 13, 1818 in the town of Canaan, Maine, then part of the state of Massachusetts, on what is known as 'Harris Hill'. At the age of nine years his parents moved onto another hill farm in the town of (West) Hartland, now Canaan, and which still bears the name of 'Chase Hill'.

Of this pioneer family of seven children, Elvira Moody settled in Cornville; Benjamin, Cyrus, Amos, Ripley, Johnathan H. and Richard G. made their homes in Canaan, while Almeda, wife of Oakman S. Abell, resided in Bowdoin, Maine. All with one exception, Ripley Chase of Canaan, have passed to the beyond.

Benjamin, being the eldest son, had many a hard task to perform in those early days. When but a mere lad he was sent on horseback through the wilderness on many and various errands in all conditions of weather, often going to Skowhegan, or Milburn as it was then called, with a bag of corn to mill, or a horse to be shod, and many an interesting story has he related of those early days, such as helping to drive the bears from the cornfields at night with fire brands, and going to Bangor and Ellsworth with an ox team with farm produce to market. In his youth he had many experiences which boys of today know little about, all of which went to make up the sturdiness of his character which was woven into the very warp and woof of his life and made him staunch and true to the end. Every young man struggling to win his way upward always had his sympathy and assistance if needed.

At the age of 22 years Mr. Chase was first married to Miss Lovina Connor of Skowhegan and settled on a small farm adjoining his father's. But his ambitious nature could not long remain and toil on land so unremunerative and hard to till, and with many protestations of failure from his parents he sold out and bought the valley farm at Brown's Corner, then nearly all forest.

He built all the buildings on the place, developed and made additions to the farm which was his home for 37 years, making it one of the finest and most profitable in the country. Five children were born to them, Mrs. Annie M. Drew who died in Woodside, California on October 23, 1866; Charles B., a soldier of the Civil War who received a fatal wound at the Battle of Antietam and died October 22, 1862; Mrs. Jennie M. Whitney of Valley Mills, Texas, Liola W. Chase of Cleburne, Texas, and Mrs. Lucie E. Crowell of Pittsfield.

The wife and mother passed away June 20, 1874, and later Mr. Chase was united in marriage to Mrs. Adaline B. Crowell of Canaan. After a few years Mr. and Mrs. Chase went to live in Canaan Village where they enjoyed the comforts of a good home until the weight of declining years made a change necessary to insure the tender care which would be given by their son and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Isaiah Crowell, in their home in Pittsfield where they moved in October 1904, and where Mrs. Chase passed away on December 13, 1906.

One year ago Mr. Chase was able to gratify a long cherished desire to visit again with his children and grandchildren in Texas and his daughter, Mrs. Crowell, accompanied him thither. Four months were very pleasantly spent in that sunny land. An accident, greatly deplored by his friends, occurred while riding and from which he never fully recovered, but he never regretted going. Five grandchildren and one great grandchild live to bless his memory.

Mr. Chase was a Republican and held town offices in Canaan. He was a honored member of Carrabassett Lodge of F. & A. M., and was Chaplain for several years; a lifelong Universalist which faith he enjoyed to the end which came on January 27, 1907 as a sequel to a stroke of paralysis on January 17th.

Rev. F. A. Tuttle, Pastor of the First Universalist Church of Pittsfield, conducted prayers at his late home on Somerset Avenue on Tuesday, January 29th, at 10 a.m., and at the final service at the church in Canaan at 2 p.m., he spoke words of comfort to the large gathering of relatives and friends. The sad but beautiful Masonic ceremony was performed in the church by a large delegation of that order. The bearers were Masonic brethren, Richard Harris, Charles Harris, George Smith, George Barrett and the remains were placed in the receiving tomb awaiting interment in the family lot. 'Lead Kindly Light', 'Abide with Me', and 'Jesus Lover of My Soul' were beautifully rendered in song by Mrs. Charles Harris and Mrs. George Weeks.
