Josiah Billings, Jr *s/o Josiah Billings, Sr & Hannah Whitney* b. 11 Aug 1820 Lancaster, Massachusetts d. 5 Nov 1904 Charles City, Iowa (Riverside Cemetery, Charles City, Iowa) at 84yrs m1. 13 Apr 1846 Lancaster, Massachusetts Lydia Ellen Monroe b. 1823 Lancaster, Massachusetts d. 14 Feb 1864 Hartland (Ireland Cemetery) & 40yrs *He was educated at Groton Academy (now Lawrence Academy) in Massachusetts. He learned the tanning trade from his father who was a Tanner in Massachusetts. He first came to Brownfield, Maine in 1845 living there in C/1850 where he was noted as a Tanner with his wife Ellen and their only child Edward.*

In 1856, Josiah purchased a large piece of property including water rights from James Moor on the northern side of the Upper Dam where he built the 2nd tannery in Hartland. He also built a hide drying house, storehouse and a boarding house for some of his dozen or so tannery employees. He built their family house on the corner of future North Street & Upper Mill Street.

The small section of road (future Upper Mill Street) leading from the Mill Street Bridge to his tannery was first known as Bridge Street. The northerly road (future North Street) leading across from his tannery to future Commercial Street (then known as North Street) first came to be called Tannery Street then Billings Street before their respective current street names were voted on and changed in 1897.

Following Lydia's death, he remarried to Marcia Tibbetts in 1866 and in 1867 sold his tannery and properties to Greenville Jefferson Shaw and his father Charles Shaw. He and Marcia moved soon after to Charles City, Iowa near Rockford, Iowa living there in C/1870 where he became a farmer and remained the rest of his life. He was a life time member of the East Somerset Agricultural Society in Hartland.

 She was a teacher and was also noted as the first female Assistant Principal at Hartland
 Academy under Principal Jonathan Soule. Edward moved from Hartland to Rockford, Iowa
 where he was living in C/1870 with Hiram Starbird of Hartland and his family (See Starbird
 Family). Addie was living with her parents in St Albans in C/1870 but they also moved to
 Rockford soon after 1870 along with her sister Marhon who married St Albans native Elmer E.
 Turner, a son of well-known shovel manufacture Napoleon Bonaparte Turner, Sr.

Edward & Addie were living in Rockford, Iowa after their marriage in C/1880 with their 5 children and her parents living with them. Following her father William's death in 1886, his remains were returned to St Albans and interred at Maloon Cemetery. Her mother Nancy

remained living with them in Rockford until her death in 1902 and is also interred in the family plot at Riverside Cemetery.

As noted in Edward's obituary, they had been regular seasonal visitors to Biloxi since 1913 where they were staying at the time of his death. Addie visited Hartland several times following Edward's death where local newspaper articles reported her stories of teaching at the Academy.

Marion Elizabeth Monroe
b. May 1833 Lancaster, Massachusetts
d. 1917 Charles City, Iowa (Riverside Cemetery, Charles City, Iowa w/Josiah)
They had no children.
She is noted as the younger sister of Josiah's 1st wife Lydia Monroe. She married 1st in Massachusetts in 1854 to Humphrey Barrett who died in Lancaster, Massachusetts in 1885. She is interred in the same lot with Josiah & Marcia noted as Marion E. Billings.
