*Fanny's father Levi Powers moved the family from Hollis, New Hampshire to the Canaan area in the early 1770s and was elected Town Constable at the 1st Town Meeting following Canaan's incorporation on June 18, 1788.*

*Jeremiah arrived in Canaan from Wells about 1803 where he built and operated the first saw mill in what became the center of Canaan Village where he was reported to have owned a large amount of property. He was living with his oldest son Clement in West Hartland in C/1850 following Fanny's death.*

*Jeremiah's younger brother, James Goodwin (1775-1859), also settled in Canaan and cleared a hillside farm in Canaan Village near Carrabassett Stream on what was then known as Goodwin Hill. James and his 1st wife Beulah Perkins had a family of 5 sons & 3 daughters including, in order of birth, Esther, Jeremiah, James, Anne, Miles, Caleb, Jane & William Goodwin.*

*Jeremiah & Fanny's birth places & dates as well as their children's names & birth dates in Canaan noted below as recorded on May 27, 1814 in Canaan Vital Records. (See bottom for original copy)*

*Wallace took over the family homestead in West Hartland following his father's death. Mary married 1st in 1885 to Charles E. Spaulding; widowed 1895. 2 of their Spaulding children, Carrie at 14 & Fred at 7, were living with her & Wallace in West Hartland in C/1900 along with their 3yr old son Leon Goodwin and infant daughter Lelia Goodwin at 8mths old. Mary & Wallace were divorced by C/1910 when she was a housekeeper for John Dane Nevens in Hartland until his death in 1933 while she lived there with her son Stanley Goodwin. (See Nevens Family)*

*They were living in Canaan in C/1830 before any children had been born. Accounts of their older children's births indicate they then lived in Madison for a time before moving to Aroostook County by C/1840 where they were listed with children in Township 1, Range 5 near Benedicta.*

*An unconfirmed story implies Mary Ann and her infant child were traveling when they died at Millmore Place, a stage coach stop near Benedicta at that time. Her grave location is known today as the Mary Cobb Burial Site in Township 1, Range 5 about 6.5 miles south of Benedicta on the Aroostook Road. The now fenced in single headstone is situated on the left side of the road when headed south and is engraved, "In memory of Mary Ann - Wife of Stephen Cobb - who died Dec. 30, 1843 æ 38". Additional engraving below this has not yet been transcribed.*

*Stephen remarried soon after Mary Ann's death to Zilla Young (1810-1898) and had 2 more children, Florence (1847-1938) & Julia (1849-1868), by the time the family was enumerated on July 22nd as noted on the 1850 Census in Bendicta Plantation. In 1850, he left Aroostook County soon after along with his two oldest sons Francis H. Cobb and Steven Alonzo Cobb for Minnesota settling first in St Anthony Falls in Minneapolis. He returned to Maine the following fall to bring the rest of the family to Minnesota where 2 more children were born to them, Llewellyn (1853-1913) & Edway (1855-1930). His accidental death was reported in local newspapers, "Stephen Cobb of Nininger, in drawing a bucket of water Tuesday, slipped and fell into the well, breaking his neck."*

*It is to be noted that accounts written later by and for his sons Francis & Stephen indicate they left Maine in winter of 1849-1850 and arrived in Minnesota in spring of 1850. Albeit slightly contradictory to the July 22, 1850 Census enumeration date, it is respectfully included for review.*

*"Francis H. Cobb died at the home of his (half) brother, Llewellyn A. Cobb. Mr. Cobb was one of the pioneers of Minneapolis, having lived here since 1850. He was born in Maine, Aug 25, 1830. At the age of 20 years, he came to St. Anthony, with his father, Stephen Cobb, arriving in the spring of 1850, and since then has been identified with the interests of this city. He platted Cobb's addition to St. Anthony and to North Minneapolis. Mr. Cobb enlisted in the Civil War and was a First Lieutenant until the end of the war."*

He was the architect of about 200 theatres across the country."*

She moved with Stephen and his family to Turtle Lake, Wisconsin around 1877 and then onto Le Grande, Oregon with them in 1883. His brother Eugene joined him there as did his sister Josephine and her family. Rachel's headstone notes her as "Rachel Goodwin, Wife of Bryant Richardson". Their 5 oldest children's names & birthdates are as noted in Canaan Vital Records.*

*"Steve F. Richardson, who is living retired in La Grande, was the pioneer in the export lumber trade in his district, having been connected with that business in Oregon since 1883. He served his native State of Maine as a member of its legislature in 1873, and his adopted State of Oregon in the same capacity in 1907. By his active and successful business career in the La Grande District he did valuable service in developing its resources and has long been regarded as one of its most influential citizens.*

*He was born in Hartland, Somerset County, Maine on February 23, 1842, the son of Bryant and Rachel (Goodwin) Richardson, both natives of the same place. The grandfather, Joel Richardson, was a native of England and immigrated to the New World, establishing his home in America. The Goodwins were of Scotch ancestry and were successful and respected in Maine, where the family settled on coming to this*

*country. The Richardson Family in Maine was engaged in the lumber industry and the subject of this review received a thorough training in that line of business.*

*He pursued his education in the schools of his native state and after leaving aside his text books embarked in lumbering. After remaining in his native state for some time he removed to Wisconsin and was there engaged in lumbering for a period of seven years. In the fall of 1883 he came to Oregon and settled in the Grande Ronde valley, entering that section on the back of an Indian pony. He spent some time looking over the land in that neighborhood for opportunities in his business, having associated with him some eastern capitalists.*

*Finding what he readily perceived was an excellent chance to launch a good business, he made a favorable report to his principals and with sufficient capital at his disposition the river was cleaned so that logs might be floated on its waters. Wing and flood dams were built and everything placed in readiness for logging operations. A sawmill was also built under Mr. Richardson's supervision at Stump Town, now known as Perry, and the business which was successfully launched was continued by Mr. Richardson until 1900, when he partially retired, although still retaining an interest in some of the mills.*

*He has valuable real-estate holdings in addition to his lumber interests, owning a farm of Two Hundred and Eighty-five acres four miles east of Island City and Ten acres of orchard land one mile from La Grande. He also has lumber interests in the state of Idaho.*

*On May 21, 1870, Mr. Richardson was united in marriage to Miss Lilla Burrell, of Somerset County, Maine, a daughter of George and Olive (Tupper) Burrell, natives of the same locality. The father was a successful agriculturist, following that occupation during his lifetime.*

*Mr. Richardson has always taken an active interest in politics and being an influential and representative citizen. He is widely known in the state of Oregon, being well acquainted in the La Grande district in Union County, where he is respected by all who know him and held in high esteem by a large number of his business, political and social friends. He is possessed of much more than ordinary business ability and his long career in the logging industry and lumber trade has been a very successful one.” ~ Centennial History of Oregon 1811-1912*
