*They moved from New Gloucester to Hartland, then still part of St Albans, around 1825. It is unknown who came first but his sister Louisa and her husband Dr. Calvin Blake also arrived in the area around the same time. Peleg & Lois likely built the house where they lived on future Commercial Street which later become the home of Reverend Augustus T. Bowman and eventually owned among others by Ervin W. Martin. Peleg was on the original Board of Directors of St Albans/Hartland Academy in 1832 serving as Vice-President. He was a Hartland Post Master and served as Hartland Town Coroner in 1856.*

*Peleg graduated from Hartland Academy then studied at Colby College. He studied medicine under various physicians including his uncle, Dr. Calvin Blake, then graduated from the Medical School of Maine in Portland in 1856. He began practicing medicine in Hartland at the future Harrington Block on Main Street before they moved to Stockton Springs soon after 1860. Following Almira's death, he remarried Sarah Blanchard in 1867 and moved to St Paul, Minnesota in 1879 with their 2 children where he continued his practice until his death.*

### Medical Class of 1856.

PELEG SPRAGUE HASKELL, son of Peleg C. and Louise (Fogg) Haskell, was born 11 May, 1832, at St. Albans. He was prepared for college at the academy in his native town, and was for two years a member of the class of 1854 in Colby University. He then entered upon the study of medicine, having as preceptors Dr. Calvin Blake, Prof. E. R. Peaslee, and Dr. J. M. Moriarty, and attended courses of lectures at the New Hampshire Medical School, at the Deer Island Hospital, and at the Medical School of Maine, where he graduated in 1856. He began practice in Hartland, but after two years removed to Stockton, where he won a good reputation as a skillful physician. He was a member of the American Medical Association, the Maine Medical Association, and for a number of years served as treasurer of the Waldo County Medical Association. He contributed to the transactions of the State association papers upon "Criminal Abortion," "Hygiene of Our Homes," and "Unusual Cases of Malaria." In 1879 he removed to St. Paul, Minn., where he died 26 September, 1890.

Dr. Haskell married, first, in 1856, Almira Page, of Hartland, and second, in 1867, Sarah Blanchard, of Stockton, who, with two sons and a daughter, survives him.

They had both moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota by 1887 where they married and were living in C/1900 where Archie operated a hardware store. By C/1920, they had moved to Seattle, Washington along with her Aunt Wealthy Page. She and Archie were still living in Seattle in C/1930 and were living with their daughter Marion and son-in-law Samuel Vigus in Seattle in C/1940.*

*Haskell & Company to Lord, Haskell & Company but the main product remained moccasins. His death certificate noted he had been living for 6 months in New Jersey at the time of his death.*



*He was raised in Hartland and moved to South Paris in 1859 with his brother Merrill when he was 18yrs old where they were both living in the Mary Deering household in C/1860 noted as clerks at a general store. Edwin enlisted for the war in South Paris on August 18, 1862 but contracted Typhoid Fever and was released from service on 30 January 30, 1863. He then joined Edwin at his new general store business in South Paris and soon after married Lorinda.*

*They returned to Hartland where Edwin opened a new dry goods and tailoring store with Lorinda's brother Leonard C. Young operating as Haskell & Young as one of the first stores on Commercial Street. In late 1876, they parted business ways with her brother and sold the store business to Charles H. Skinner. They were residing in Deering by C/1880 before moving to the Waterville area where they remained until their deaths within 2 weeks of each other.*

**EDWIN NELSON HASKELL**  
Civil War Veteran

WATERVILLE, Jan. 6 (AP)—Edwin Nelson Haskell, one of the oldest citizens of Waterville and the oldest veteran of the Civil War, died at his home at 56 Burleigh street, Thursday, following a brief illness.

Mr. Haskell was born in Hartland, March 31, 1841, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Peleg Sprague Haskell. He made his home in Hartland until he was about 18 years of age when he went to South Paris and entered a general store.

At the age of 21 he joined the 17th Maine Regiment, leaving from South Paris for Washington and later was transferred to Virginia where he contracted typhoid fever and was discharged from the army. He returned home and as soon as his health would permit, he entered the general store with his brother, Merrill Haskell, who was then proprietor.

Sept. 7, 1865, he married Miss Lorinda C. Young of South Paris and made their home in that town for eight years after which they moved to Hartland where they resided five years. They went to Portland and ten years later to Fairfield; then to Waterville.

Mr. Haskell traveled for the Charles B. Varney Co. of Portland, manufacturers of the Ceresota flour, for 42 years and was admitted to the firm. About eight years ago, he resigned from active duties.

He was a member of the W. S. Heath Post, G. A. R., the Three Quarters Century club, Congregational church, and has been a Mason for 70 years, being an honorary member of the Deering lodge of Woodford; a member of the Quarter Century Traveling Men's Association, and is one of the oldest members, both in age and membership, in the Masonic fraternity in Maine.

Mr. Haskell is survived by his widow; two sons, Carl N. and Harry C., both of Portland; three grandchildren, Norman E., Roger R., and Nelson C. Haskell; two

*They moved from Turner to Hartland in December of 1825 around the same time as her brother Peleg where Dr. Blake continued his medical practice and remained in active practice for forty-two years. He was greatly involved with town politics and was on the original Board of Trustees for Hartland Academy. He owned a large area of land of which part of it became Blake Street. He eventually built a new house near the corner of Academy Street and Commercial Street which still stands today. Their children's names and birth dates were recorded in St Albans Vital Records as their residence on Academy Street was part of St Albans until 1846 when it was annexed to become part of Hartland.*
