Charles Annis was born around 1638 in Enniskillen, Ireland and is the first known ancestor of this family line in the New World. He left his homeland in 1662 and sailed for Massachusetts at about 24 years old and eventually settled in Newbury, Massachusetts where he married and raised his family. His grandson Charles Annis moved to Wells, Maine in 1715. His great-grandson Nehemiah Annis moved to Sanford by C/1790.

Charles & Eleanor were living in Sanford in C/1820 then moved to West Waterville by C/1830 likely following their son Dudley Annis who had moved there previously. Eleanor came to Hartland with her daughter Sally at some point after Charles' death and were both living with her daughter Joanna (Annis) Ricker and her family in Hartland in C/1850 noted at 82yrs old.

They moved from Sanford around 1818 and were living in West Waterville in C/1820. They moved to Clinton where they were living in C/1830. They moved to Hartland soon after the birth of their son Joseph in 1837 and were noted in Hartland in C/1840. His widowed mother Eleanor and his sister Sally later came to Hartland after his father's death. Dudley & Abigail remained in Hartland as noted in C/1850 & C/1860. Dudley's death occurred just before the 1870 Census was taken in July when Abigail was living with their daughter Lydia (Annis) Ham and her husband Darius Ham in West Hartland until Lydia's death in 1878. Abigail was living with their son Joseph Annis' wife Eliza and their son Wallace in Hartland in C/1880 until her death.

He was living with his paternal grandparents in Hartland in C/1860. He enlisted for the war in Hartland on December 13, 1863 and assigned to the Unassigned Maine Infantry, Co. D. He was later assigned on January 6, 1865 to the Maine Coast Guard, Company D. They were both living in Hartland when they married in Somersworth, New Hampshire and moved there soon after living there in C/1880 through C/1900. He was also noted there in the 1890 Census Special Surviving Civil War Veteran Schedule. His incomplete death certificate only notes his name as Charles H. Annis, born in Hartland and his date, place and cause of death at about 67yrs old. His residence at the time, his wife's name and his parents' names are not noted.

They had no known children.

She was listed with her parents in Hartland in C/1850 as 19yr old Hellen E. A. Annis. She was married and living with George in Saugus as noted in the 1855 Massachusetts State Census. Her 9yr old niece Marianne Annis (daughter of Solomon) was living with them in C/1860. They remained in Saugus in C/1870 and were noted there in C/1880 about a month before George's death. Her death certificate notes her as Ellen Phillips, widow of George W. Phillips, with her birthplace and parents' full names. George was a Class of 1828 Harvard graduate and practiced law. His father John Phillips served on the Massachusetts General Courts for 25 years. He was also President of the Massachusetts Senate and the first Mayor of Boston when it chartered as a city in 1822.

They were living with his parents with their infant son Henry in Hartland in C/1850. By C/1860, Helen was living in Lewiston with their 6yr old daughter Carrie at a boarding home while their 3 oldest children were living with other family members. It is unclear if Solomon had died by 1860 or they divorced as no further records for him are found. Helen remarried to the widower Ebenezer Abbott after 1870 but was widowed by C/1880 when she was living in Winslow along with Carrie. She was living with Carrie and her husband Isaac Sawyer in Lisbon in C/1910 listed as Helen E. Abbott, widowed at 80yrs old and noted with them again in C/1920 at 90yrs old.

He was living in the household of his Great Uncle Willoughby Taylor in Sidney in C/1860 noted at 10yrs old. He enlisted September 23, 1864 in Sidney at 14yrs old falsely reporting his age as 18yrs old. He was mustered out of service in June of 1865 following the end of the war. He moved to Wales after serving where he spent most of his adult life.

She was living with her mother at a boarding home in Lewiston in C/1860 at 6yrs old. She remained there in C/1870 until her 1st marriage then was living with her mother in Winslow in C/1880 noted as Carrie Keene, daughter, divorced. She & Isaac moved to Lisbon after they married where her mother later lived with them until her death.

Known as Morrill or J. Morrill Annis, he was raised in Hartland where he was living with his parents in C/1850 listed at 18yrs old. By C/1860, he had moved to Old Town working as a lumberman listed at 26yrs old and living at an Inn operated by John Bachelder. He enlisted for the war in Old Town on August 13, 1861 and mustered into the 7th Maine Infantry serving until he was discharged October 10, 1862 for a disability. He returned to Hartland where he was drafted June 1, 1863 with his previous service with the 7th Maine noted. He re-enlisted in Hartland on December 15, 1863 and mustered into service December 24, 1863 in Augusta giving his occupation as a Millman, 28yrs old, born in Clinton, single and a resident of Hartland. He was assigned to the 2nd Maine Cavalry joining his brother Joseph who enlisted at the same time as noted below. Officially mustered out of service August 25, 1865.

They were living in Hartland in C/1870 after they married with their infant daughter Georgia near Huff Hill where her parents had previously settled. He applied for an invalid war pension on May 31, 1872. They were living in Hartland Village on North Street in C/1880 with their children. They were living in St Albans by 1884 at the time of their daughter Mary's birth. He was also listed in St Albans for the 1890 Census Special Veterans Addendum. His death certificate lists him as Morrill J. Annis, 60yrs old with his birthplace and his parents' full names noted. He is interred at Pine Grove Cemetery as Morrill J. Annis with his name engraved as J. Morrill Annis as a memorial on his parents' stone at Ireland Cemetery. Susan applied for widow's pension on May 27, 1892 and returned to Hartland living on North Street by C/1900 with their children Myrtle, Mary & James.

Following Morrill's death, their 5 oldest children's names & birth dates were noted on June 29, 1892 in St Albans Vital Records by Dr. Harris Pushor who certified he was the family attending physician for each birth. On July 16, 1892, Dr. Charles A. Moulton added a delayed certificate of birth for his 1887 delivery of their 6th and youngest child James Howard Annis in St Albans.

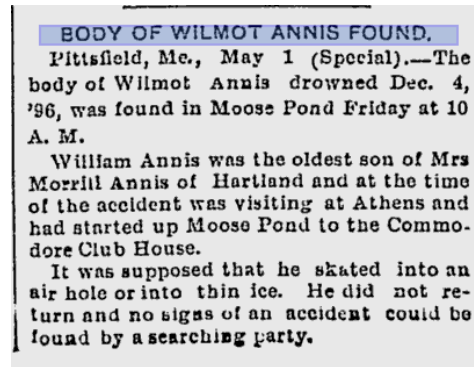

John was active in local town and civic affairs and served for a number of years as Chairman of the Hartland Board of Selectman. Mary taught for some 40+ years in area schools including 30+ years at Hartland Grammar Schools beginning around 1913 through 1945 including Grades 4, 5, 6 & 7. In 1919, she and Miss Annie Fuller (later Mrs. Annie Fuller Linn) introduced the first Hot Lunch Program at the Hartland Village Schools. Following her retirement, she served on the Hartland School Committee until 1950.
