Richard Church b. c1608 England d. 26 Dec 1668 Dedham, Massachusetts m. 7 Mar 1636/7 Elizabeth Warren d/o Richard Warren & Elizabeth Walker b. 1617 England d. 9 Mar 1669/70 Hingham, Massachusetts Richard Church, a carpenter, originally came from England to Wessagusset (Weymouth) in the Massachusetts Bay Colony. He was in Plymouth in February 1631/2 as a "sojourner," or temporary resident, but remained in Plymouth. In 1649, he removed to Eastham, was in Charlestown by 1652 and moved to Hingham in 1654. He served on a number of juries while in Plymouth Colony. His estate included half of a tide mill and a share of the iron works at Taunton.

Elizabeth's father Richard Warren arrived on the Mayflower. At the time of the Mayflower's voyage, Richard and his wife had five daughters; Mary, Ann, Sarah, Elizabeth and Abigail but had decided to wait until conditions in the New World were satisfactory before bringing over his family. Bradford's recollection notes; "Mr. Richard Warren, but his wife and children were lefte behind, and came afterwards."

They moved from Barrington, New Hampshire to Hallowell, Maine in 1795. They settled in West
Hartland about 1811 at what became Church's Corner near Morrill Pond. In 1813, he enlisted for The
War of 1812 and Died in Service at Sackett's Harbor, New York. Martha remarried about 1818 to John

Sibley, Sr of Canaan and had 3 Sibley children; Matilda, Benjamin & Christopher Sibley.

In a November 2, 1818 ruling by Somerset County Probate Judge Bryce McLellan, guardianship of their 5 youngest children was appointed to Ebenezer Odlin of Canaan Gore, so called, listing them as Harriet Church, Greenleaf Church & Drusilla Church, "minors under 14 years old", and Polly Church & Abigail Church as "minors over 14 years old" and all noted as "children & heirs of Benjamin Church, late of Canaan Gore, and late a soldier who died in service of the United States."

His father remarried to Roxanna in 1828 and moved from Readfield to West Hartland soon after 1830 settling at what became known as Bean's Corner Road. Charles was living there with his parents in C/1850 with his older half-brother Ebenezer Bean and his family living a couple houses away noted in a separate household. Harriet & Charles were living on the Bean's Corner Road after they married as noted on the 1860 Somerset County Map. They were likely at his father's original homestead with his 78yr old widowed mother Roxanna living with them in C/1860 and Ebenezer still living nearby. They took over the old William Larrabee homestead after C/1870 living there in C/1880 and as noted on the 1883 Somerset County Map. Charles was still living in West Hartland in C/1900 noted as a 70yr old widow with his son Herman and family living with him. It appears he then moved to Canaan with his son Hermon where they both died in 1906 as noted on their death certificates.

He purchased a farm in Scott's Flats, California living there in C/1880 listed as a "Teamster". He moved to San Francisco soon after where he worked as a Janitor for the California Bank for 30 years. In his 1913 Will, he left most of his estate of some \$35,000 to his "4 living siblings" however by the time of his death only his brothers John & Winfield were alive to inherit it.



Maine with mapmaker Jacob Chace, Jr when the government of Nova Scotia became interested in map making and contracted Chace, had already surveyed portions of the province, for a series of 18 county maps in 1862. Ambrose took over the contract in 1865 relocating to Bedford, Nova Scotia for the duration of the work." He had moved to Rio to live with his son Harold soon after the end of WWI where he died of a stroke.

She was living in Hartland in C/1860 with her parents noted at 21 years old. She moved

to Nebraska soon after possibly with her sister Hannah and married there in 1869.

They were living in Omaha, Nebraska in C/1870 where he was listed as a photographer. They were living in Niobrara, Nebraska in C/1880, noted as a photographer, until at least 1885 when they were noted in the Nebraska State Census. They were living in Hot Springs, South Dakota in C/1900 with their children Florence, George & Clara.

"Photographer of the Nebraska & South Dakota frontier, William Richard Cross was born in Bennington County, Vermont, in 1839. His older brother, Daniel H. Cross, (a famous Union Army photographer during the Civil War) taught him photography.

In 1869, Cross married Jennie Church of Hartland, Maine and they moved to Omaha, Nebraska that same year. He was one of the first professional photographers to live on the Great Plains.

Cross and his wife moved to Creighton in 1871 where they spent seven years. Cross took his tent gallery around Knox County photographing the area and its people. Announcements run in the Niobrara Pioneer would notify local people that he was coming to their area. Cross also photographed Native Americans. He belonged to a circle of other professional photographers that wished to satisfy the demand for photographs of Native Americans.

On February 14, 1878 Cross and his family left Creighton for the Spotted Tail Agency, which became Rosebud, in Todd County, South Dakota. There they stayed for four or more months so Cross could photograph Native Americans. Cross spent next twelve years, beginning in July 1878, in Niobrara, in northern Knox County, Nebraska. His gallery was opened on July 4, but began traveling again by the end of that month. Cross went to the Santee Agency where the Minnesotan Santee Sioux were moved after the uprising in 1862. These were very productive years for Cross and he was held in high esteem among the local residents.

In 1886, after some more traveling to photograph Native Americans in the Niobrara-Valentine area in north-central Nebraska, where Cross met his apprentice, John A. Anderson, he opened a studio at Fort Niobrara. In 1888, Cross and Anderson conspired at Fort Meade, near the Black Hills of South Dakota. Anderson left to become a civilian photographer for the U.S. Army and became a well-known photographer while living on the Rosebud Indian Reservation. Cross spent the remainder of the decade photographing in the Hot Springs, South Dakota area.

Cross acquired a gallery that belonged to J.W. Pike in Hot Springs, where he chose to live in proximity to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Toward the end of 1890, there was tension building amongst white settlers and the military in regard to Ghost Dance movement of the Sioux. It was here, on December 29, 1890, at Wounded Knee Creek that U.S. soldiers slaughtered Big Foot's group of Miniconjou Sioux. No photographers were present for the bloodshed. Although another photographer, George E. Trager of Chadron, Nebraska, was credited with photographing the first images of the slaughter's aftermath, Cross reportedly visited the site in mid-January of 1891. The number of photographs Cross took on that venture is unknown.

After this, Cross did not seem to travel anymore, but kept busy in Hot Springs. He spent time on landscape photography and compiled a sizable collection of Black Hills Views. In November of 1900, Cross opened another studio on Minnekahta Avenue in Hot Springs, where he worked until his death. According to an article in the Hot Springs Weekly printed in August 1904, 'Mr. Cross of this city is a pioneer photographer of the Black Hills Country and occupies a foremost position among business men identified with that line of work.' He died of pneumonia, at the age of sixty eight, on December 23, 1907.

Cross had three daughters, Florence, Clara, and Mrs. L.G. (Lillian Gertrude) Miller, and a son, George. William and Jennie's first child, a son (Paul), died before they moved to Creighton. Although many scholars neglect the importance of Cross's work, he was, according to William C. Darrah, 'One of the most prolific and unappreciated western photographers'."
