Records are scarce with often conflicting information of either's birth place and none for their deaths or parents' names. The only known death certificate for their children was Nancy's in 1894 which noted her father and her mother by maiden name noting both born in Falmouth; unconfirmed information likely passed to one of her surviving children. Nancy's maiden name was also noted on a couple of their children's marriage certificates along with William's name but with no birth location for either.

A circumstantial suggestion of their possible birth places comes from the 1880 Census which was the first to ask which state or other country parents were born. George, Nancy & Martha were their only children still alive by then and all of them provided their father & mother born in Maine.

William was not listed in the first Census taken in 1810 for St Albans, then known as Fairhaven, however his 1810 residence may have been Falmouth, based on Nancy's death certificate reference, where the household of a William Cook was listed with enumerated male & female age categories matching him & Nancy and their 4 oldest children. This Census had limited categories with a broad range of ages placing him & Nancy between 26 and 44yrs old equating to birth years between 1766 and 1784.

1810 Census Falmouth, Maine - Household of William Cook: 3 Males under 10 (possibly sons Edwin at 5yrs, William at 1yr & infant John), 1 Male 26 thru 44 (William, Head of Household), 1 Female under 10 (possible daughter Lydia at 3yrs) 1 Female 26 thru 44 (possibly wife Nancy).

St Albans incorporated as a town on June 14, 1813. While it is possible William moved his family there soon after 1810, the first confirmed record of William residing there is from a voter's list of St Albans citizens in 1816. His household was first listed in a Census in St Albans in 1820 which still included a broad range of age categories enumerating him & Nancy between 26yrs old and 44yrs old.

The 1830 Census in St Albans added several new age categories narrowing down William & Nancy's ages to between 40yrs and 50yrs old equating to a birth year between 1780 and 1790. With their first child's documented birth in 1805, it is therefore <u>presumed</u> they were both born sometime between 1780 and 1784 putting them between 21yrs old and 25yrs old in 1805.

By 1840, they had moved to Hartland apparently with several of their younger adult children living in the large household. Both William & Nancy were enumerated in the 50yrs to 59yrs old category. This was the last known Census which Nancy is included. There is no known record of either of their deaths however an entry in St Albans Vital Records notes the March 6, 1845 marriage of Mr. William Cook and Mrs. Dorothy Austin (unknown 1st husband or maiden name), both noted residing in Hartland at the time.

This marriage was followed by an 1850 Census listing in the neighboring town of Harmony of William Cook reporting himself born in New Hampshire at 68yrs old (c1782) along with his then wife Dorothy Cook at 49yrs old. Also listed in the household, without any relationships provided, were Francis Austin at 25yrs, Mary Austin at 16yrs & Racheal Austin at 14yrs; her presumed children from her 1st marriage.

It is to be noted there is also circumstantial evidence indicating William had at least a couple of brothers, Willoby Cook (1780-1860) and Issachar Cook (1784-1862), who had already settled in St Albans well before his arrival suggesting a possible motive for William to eventually move there. Both Willoby & Issachar were included in the 1810 Census for Fairhaven as mentioned above.

Issachar married Susan Hackett (1789-1856), daughter of Jonah Hackett who is credited as the 1st settler in St Albans about 1800. Among Issachar & Susan's children was Robert Cook (1811-1892) who married Miriam Smith and later adopted Edwin Maine Cook's young son George A. Cook as noted below further suggesting the family connection. William & Nancy's son Robert would note himself as Robert Cook II throughout his adult life and was likely named for his possible older first cousin.

Like William's daughter Mary Cook, Issachar's son Judah Cook (1823-1899) married into the Woodbury Family via Susanna Woodbury (sister of Mary's husband Isaiah) with their daughter Hannah marrying Zerah Emery whose descendants connect to several other Hartland families. (See David Emery Family)

Issachar & Susan also had a son named Willoby (1829-1863) presumed to be named after his brother's unique name. Another son Lyman Cook (1831-1902) moved to Hartland and remains in historical infamy as it was suspected the fire which burned down the new Opera House in 1897 was set by his six year old grandson who, with a small companion, was reported to have been playing with matches in the stable.

Although Issachar reported his birth place as New Hampshire in C/1850 & C/1860, his brother Willoby reported his birth place as Maine in C/1850 while living in Palmyra giving no absolute confirmation of William's birth place which he provided in C/1850 as New Hampshire. Issachar & Susan remained in St Albans the rest of their lives and are interred together at Sleeper Cemetery on St Albans Mountain.

Vital Records of St Albans list the William & Nancy Cook Family with their 10 children's names and their birth dates compiled originally after the birth of their 7th child in 1816 based on the format. The record does not include any of the children's birth places but it is unlikely some of their oldest children were born in St Albans based on the historical information above.
