He served in Captain Reed's Massachusetts Militia Company in 1755 during the assault of Crown Point, New York which was the first formidable French military fort in the Champlain Valley Region. Soon after 1765, Zachariah & Esther moved to Gouldsboro with their family where he drowned with his sons Zachariah, Jr and Samuel on October 15, 1768 "when a sudden storm swamped their boat while they were fishing in the bay off Gouldsboro." It is unclear where Esther and her surviving children lived following Zachariah's death but it is possible she returned with them to Massachusetts.

Uzziel enlisted in the Revolutionary War on April 4, 1781 for a period of three years serving as a Private under Captain Williams in the 2nd Massachusetts Regiment under the command of Colonel Sprout. He was discharged in November of 1783 in Peekskill, New York at the end of the war.

Following the end of the Revolutionary War, opportunities for land ownership were made available through land bounties for many of the Veterans including the 'wilderness' lands in the Province of Maine, then still a part of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

"Among the early settlers of Norridgewock were members of the Withee family. Uzziel came to Norridgewock with his brother Luke in 1783. They both owned land lots and certainly cleared portions of them for farming and built log cabins. Uzziel returned to Groton in 1797 to marry Betsey Stevens then they both returned to Norridgewock. In the 1800 Census he is shown as married and living in

Norridgewock. Luke would remain there for the rest of his life." Their brother Zoe was an early settler of Industry, Maine in 1797. ~ Norridgewock Historical Society - Compiled by Lucille Greer

Uzziel & Betsey were living in Norridgewock in the 1800 Census but by the Census of 1810, taken in what was then known as Township No. 3, Range 4 of Somerset County, they had moved their family to what became North Hartland where Withee Pond (now known as Bog Pond) and Withee Brook would bear their surname and remained there until Betsey's death when he moved in with his daughter Mary.

Uzziel and his sons Asa and Ezra were some of the early settlers who signed the 1819 petition to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts General Court to incorporate as the town of Hartland.

His pension request in 1818 was approved but his land bounty grant for 200 acres was denied because he "hadn't enlisted for the duration of the war." In 1820, he stated that he was lame and couldn't work. In his household at the time was his wife Betsey and their two daughters Elizabeth, age 15 and Mary, age 13. Eventually he received two pensions.

Uzziel lived to be the oldest known surviving Revolutionary War Veteran in Somerset County, the 2nd oldest in Maine and one of the oldest in the country; the oldest known was John Kitts of Pennsylvania who died in 1870 at 108yrs old. Uzziel was 97 years, 4 months and 18 days old when he died in 1862 according to his grave stone. He and Betsey are interred with a couple of their children, several grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Sally is a sister to Rebecca Gould who married his brother Ezra Withee, Sr.

Sarah arrived in Maine from Canada with her parents in 1840. She married 1st to Thomas Wilson Chambers Sr and resided in Bangor in C/1850, widowed about 1851, 2 children; James Chambers (b.1848) & Thomas Wilson Chambers Jr (1850-1893, Crocker Cemetery, St Albans).

Following their marriage, they were living in Bangor in C/1860 with her 2 sons and their 2 oldest children then moved to Corinna soon after and were living there in C/1870.

Imlah was last noted living at the Town Poor Farm in Hartland in C/1880 suffering from rheumatics while Sarah and their 2 youngest daughters were living with her son Thomas Chambers Jr and his family in St Albans. Family records indicate he "suffered from fits and committed suicide" but no death certificate has been found yet to confirm. Sarah was living with her daughter Estelle and her family in Harpswell in C/1900 noted as a Widow. Her gravestone notes, "Wife of I. Judson Withee"

They resided in Hartland in C/1850 after they married before moving to Corinna by C/1860. They were living in Kenduskeag by C/1870 and Bangor by C/1880. By C/1900, they had separated and Sarah was living in Ellsworth with her daughter Maude and moved with her to Lynn, Massachusetts by C/1910 noting herself married in both reports.

Joseph was one of the original settlers of the first American colony in Cuba around 1900 known as La Gloria Colony. An account of his time in Cuba was written in the 1901 book, 'Pioneering In Cuba' by James M. Adams partially noting, "The old man's name, as I afterwards learned, was Joseph B. Withee. Some of the colonists who had become intimately acquainted with him familiarly called him 'Grandpa' although he was not the oldest man in the colony. His age was seventy-one years, and he hailed from the State of Maine. None of his family or friends had come to Cuba with him, but he had grown children living in the Pine Tree state. Alone and single-handed he began his pioneer life in La Gloria, but he was not daunted by obstacles or fearful of the future. On the contrary, he was most sanguine. He worked regularly every day clearing and planting his plantation, and was one of the first of the colonists to take up his residence on his own land. He soon had vegetables growing, and had set out strawberry and pineapple plants, besides a number of banana, orange, and lemon trees."

Following his time in Cuba, he purchased 39 acres of land in Mississippi in 1906 and was living with his son Herbert in Landon, Mississippi in C/1910, noting himself as widowed, and remaining there until his death.

"FALL FATAL TO OLD LANDON TRUCKER - J. B. Withee, a trucker of Landon, who fell two weeks ago from his buggy, breaking his hip, died at his home at 5 o'clock

yesterday afternoon. The accident to Mr. Withee that proved fatal occurred on 25th avenue in front of the Rhodes store and was the result of his foot slipping from his buggy step, throwing him to the ground. He was 84 years old and a trucker by occupation. Living with him at the time of his demise was a son and his wife. The remainder of his family, consisting of daughters and sons, are in Maine and Canada. For forty years the deceased was an Odd Fellow, and when his death was announced a committee of that order went to his home, and taking charge of his body, brought his remains to the parlors of the Gulfport Undertaking Company, from which he will be buried this afternoon at Evergreen cemetery. The funeral rites will be performed the chaplain of the lodge of Odd Fellows." - Daily Herald January 30, 1915

They were living in Corinna in C/1860 after they married before moving to St Albans by C/1870. They moved to Hartland by C/1880 living on Pleasant Street with their 6 youngest daughters in the house next to Ireland Cemetery. They were still living there in C/1900 just before Nancy's death in 1906. In C/1910, Alonzo was listed as the widowed Head of Household at their Pleasant Street home taken on April 7th at 70yrs old and noted working at the gristmill. His 40yr old single daughter Alice and 47yr old divorced daughter Mary (Withee) Waldron and her 2 surviving children lived with him.
