Dozens of resources were used for this compilation with some of the general family information gathered from "Genealogy of the Starbird/Starburt Family" by Alfred A. Starbird - 1942. It is noted in the book Dorothy Elliott (1872-1957) contributed the information on her family's connection to the Starbird Family.

The Starbird Family has deep roots in New England dating back to Thomas Starbird as one of the first recorded Starbirds in the New World settling in Dover, New Hampshire about 1640. Many of his descendants lived there over the next few generations including his great-great grandson, **Simeon Starbird**. Simeon's brother Thomas Starbird moved to Scarborough, Maine and his brother John Starbird to Harpswell while Simeon came to Hartland.

At least 4 of Simeon's children, **John, Nathaniel, Samuel and Hannah Starbird**, also came from Barrington, New Hampshire by 1810 and settled in North Hartland near the body of water which has since been known as Starbird Pond. They and their descendants intermarried with many old Hartland clans including Stafford, Elliott, Annis, Ham, Latty, Williams, Coston, Hinton, Hart, Gould, Rowell, Littlefield and Fogg. There were numerous **twins** born into the Starbird lineage as noted below.

Many of these families remained in Hartland or the surrounding area throughout the 1800s and into the 1900s but some heeded the call of the west and settled in places like Illinois, Minnesota, Idaho, Iowa, Nebraska, California and Washington. Every cemetery in Hartland contains members of these families who all eventually connect back to these four Hartland Starbird sibling settlers.

"Simeon Starbird's wife Abigail Caverly is the daughter of Moses Caverly and was born June 11, 1754 in Barrington, New Hampshire (just outside of Dover). She and Simeon resided a few years in Barrington, then removed by 1810 to (North) Hartland, Maine. Simeon was a pioneer of the wilderness. They had sons John, Samuel, Nathaniel, and Simeon; and daughters, one of whom married Enoch Tuttle, one married Leathers (a blacksmith in Barrington), and another (Hannah) married Daniel Ham of Hartland.

We have a brief account of Simeon by our venerable kindred friend, Daniel Caverly of Barrington, who discourses substantially as follows; 'I visited several times Simeon Starbird's family after he left Barrington and settled in the East, some two hundred miles away. He with his family proceeded to a high ridge of land in the wilderness, and on this selected the numerous acres on which to erect their habitations. With a strong arm they soon cut a road to the settlement through the woods, some four or five miles from the then small village of Athens.

They erected log cabins, felled the native forest, cleared out the stumps and stones, and in due time realized and enjoyed the transcendent rewards of their own independent, frugal industry, and the sweet satisfaction and repose of honest husbandmen. I was there in 1819. The father then had already erected a framed house, but the sons and their families were still living in log cottages, crude, but warm and convenient. Benches were in fashion in the place of chairs. Their general good cheer and kind hospitalities were grateful; not soon to be forgotten.

In 1839, I again journeyed East, and again visited the plantation still under cultivation, much improved; but Simeon and Abigail (his uncle and aunt) were not there. They were at rest, and another generation inhabited the several homesteads. Such is life in its best estate."

Simeon's service record from his great-great-great grandson Frederic Belleville Morrison's 1957 application for the Sons of the American Revolution show he served as a Private in the 2nd New Hampshire Regiment first in 1776 with Captain Smith Emerson's Company then re-enlisted in 1777 with Captain Daniel McDuffie's Company, both of which were part of the Colonial Continental Army.

They settled in future North Hartland by 1810 and were noted in the 1810 Census in Township No. 3, Range 4 before it incorporated as the town of Hartland. They were again noted living in Hartland in C/1820. They are last found noted in Hartland in C/1830 with Simeon listed as Head of Household as a Male between 80 & 90yrs old and Abigail enumerated as a Female between 70 & 80yrs old. It is unknown if they both died in North Hartland and, if so, where they were interred.

While it unknown exactly who they purchased their land from, it is noted, "Bryant Williams came from Waterville as one of the earliest settlers and bought four hundred acres of land in North Hartland from Squire Warren near the small body of water which has since become known as Starbird Pond. A part of this he sold to other incoming settlers, and the remainder he cleared for himself." (See Williams Family)

In 1912, the first Starbird Family Reunion for the descendants of Simeon & Abigail Starbird was held in Dover. The reunions would be held for several decades at various area venues drawing numerous descendants of their grandchildren who had moved to the Dover and Sangerville area as well as descendants of their children who had remained in Hartland and family members who later lived in other parts of Maine or out of state. They moved to Dover by C/1830 with their son Elbridge enumerated as 1 male 5-10yrs old and were listed in Dover again in C/1840. Charlotte is last found listed as Catherine Starbird with John in Dover in C/1850 along with Elbridge & Mary but was not mentioned in John's April 5, 1859 Will. She is noted by her maiden name Charlotte Littlefield as the mother on Mary's death certificate. John listed his surviving and deceased siblings in his Will leaving them or their heirs one dollar each and the remainder to his adopted daughter Mary.

Died in Service at the Union Regiment Hospital from a gunshot wound received aboard a Union ship departing the boat landing at Yazoo City, Mississippi.

Edwin wrote his parents one last letter while he was in the hospital transcribed below:

"Dear Father and Mother, I take perhaps the last opportunity of writing you a few lines. I received a severe wound on the boat before leaving Yazoo by a shot from one of the Rebel skirmishers who attacked the boat just before we left, killing one instantly and wounding three others. The ball struck me in the mouth and lodged in the left side of the neck, carrying several teeth with it. Today while I was gargling some water in my throat it caused bleeding and I came near bleeding to death before it could be stopped. I have no hopes of ever getting well. If I should not, don't mourn for me but remember I died an easy death and in a good cause. Dispose of the little property I have in a way that would make you the most comfortable. The expedition that moved against Vicksburg proved a failure, a great many men lost and nothing accomplished. The skirmishers fired out boats and opened on them which soon put them to flight. The fire was returned by our boys."

They moved one last time to Sleepy Eye, Brown County, Minnesota in 1874 listed there in the 1875 State Census. He had 5 more children with Sarah, some who became multi-millionaires in the drug and banking business.

Abbie remained in Wisconsin after they divorced and was noted there in C/1860 in Hancock, Waushara County as "Abby Welcome", 29yrs old, born in Maine living in the Samuel Hammond household but only with her 2 youngest children Herbert & Frank. She returned to Maine soon after where she remarried to Timothy Jordan about 1861 before her death in 1864. According to the Wellcome Family book, she took her 5 children with her to Maine before Jacob had some of them returned to Minnesota to live with him & Sarah. The eldest child Charles remained in Maine and enlisted for the war before joining his father in Minnesota by 1865. The youngest child Frank was left with his mother where he remained until he married and moved to Massachusetts.

A pair of matching military records confirm he returned to Maine with his mother soon after 1860 where he enlisted for the war on December 24, 1863 in Oxford, where his mother had remarried, serving until he was mustered out June 16, 1865. His death pension was eventually filed from Minnesota on July 10, 1890 by his widow Lucy A. Wellcome with both their names and all his unit details matching exactly. Given his age in 1863 of about 15 or 16yrs old based on the 1850 & 1860 Census, he 'misrepresented' his reported age of 21yrs old when he enlisted.

His mother died while he was serving and he moved back west after the war listed in his father's household in the 1865 Minnesota State Census in Garden City with his enumeration in a special category of "Soldier in Service on June 1, 1865".

Lucy was living with her parents at 19yrs old in Lincoln Township in Blue Earth County in C/1870 located next to Garden City just before their marriage was recorded in Blue Earth County records. The Wellcome Family book only notes, "He was a regular in the U. S. Army and was killed in Nebraska with no issue". His death date noted above is based an unconfirmed listing for his presumed interment at that cemetery.

Lucy was living in Sleepy Eye, Minnesota in C/1880 as a boarder in the Talbot household noted as a widow before moving into the household of her father-in-law Jacob Wellcome by 1885 and was still living with him in C/1900. She was named as the Executor in Jacob's 1905 Will in which he left her most of his large estate including his house, several land holdings and his personal possessions.

They had adopted her late brother Herbert's daughter Cora by 1900 following his death. They were still living there in C/1910 but moved the following year to live with their only child Chester Case in Knapp, Wisconsin. She was a patient at Northwestern Hospital at the time of her death.

They married in St Paul, Minnesota living there until the birth of their last child in 1887 when they moved soon after to Seattle where he continued his profession as a Barber. His widow Esther and their 3 surviving young children had returned to Minnesota by C/1900 and were living with various members of his family.

Frank was living with his mother in Hancock, Waushara County, Wisconsin in C/1860 listed as "Alva Welcome" and born in Wisconsin. His "age as of census day", completed on June 7th but compiled over the course of several previous weeks, was reported as 1 year old.

Further confirmation of his paternal lineage was personally provided by Frank who told the author of the Wellcome Family book his father was Jacob and he had corresponded with him when he reached manhood when his father advised him to come to Minnesota.

This information was passed along to his family as his death certificate notes Jacob Wellcome & Abbie Starbird as his parents.

Frank went to Maine with his mother soon after 1860. As noted in the Wellcome Family book, when his father brought his older siblings back west "the youngest child was left with his mother" possibly inferring his father's indifference to Frank's unexpected birth which they later reconciled. The book goes on to note, "she died when this son was about 4 years old and he was put out in a family (William & Ruth Hackett) to bring up for his work." In his own words, Frank relayed his years in the Hackett household was a miserable existence and at 17yrs old he left them refusing to return. He married Carrie in Mechanics Falls and moved to Waltham, Massachusetts by 1894.

Starbird Family Reunion - June 21, 1931 - Milo

The 1st Reunion of the Descendants of Simeon & Abigail (Caverly) Starbird was held in Dover in 1912 and continued for many years at various venues in Dover, Sangerville, North Dexter and Milo. Along with 4 of their children, Simeon & Abigail were early settlers in North Hartland in the early 1800s. Their grandson John Starbird, Jr was the first to move to the Dover area in the 1840s and was later joined by his younger brothers Aaron Starbird I and Suldin Starbird. While it was Suldin's children who appear to have initiated the idea of a Starbird Family Reunion, they would extend open invitations to all their extended Starbird Family members over the years including those who had remained in Hartland. This transcribed article with edits for some names published on Monday, June 22, 1931 by the Bangor Daily News reported the events of the day this photo was taken.

MILO - Sunday, June 21, 1931: For the third consecutive year, the Starbird Family Reunion was held at the Brockway Brothers Farm with 77 present. The spacious porch, gaily decorated with cut flowers, star-birds and the Starbird Banner, held three long tables arranged with linen and silver, groaning under dishes of good things to eat. At twelve, the company gathered around the tables and made merry while satisfying the inner man. After dinner, Mr. Elmer I. McKechnie of Dover-Foxcroft took a group picture of the company then the business meeting and program was held in the double parlors. The meeting was presided over by the President, W. M. Starbird.

Program: Hymn by Company; Invocation by Reverend J. W. Meisner; Singing by Quartet; Recitation by Douglas Starbird; Address by W. H. Farrar; Response by A. E. Tuttle; Vocal Solo by Miss Pauline Waugh; Reading by Mrs. W. H. Farrar; Reading by Mrs. N. S. Starbird; Closing Remarks by Reverend J. W. Meisner.

Under business, Officers for the new year were elected: President, W. M. Starbird; First Vice-President, J. C. Starbird; Second Vice-President, Claude Sidelinger; Secretary, Elonia Starbird; Treasurer, Addie Starbird. Entertainment Committee, Mr. and Mrs. W. M. Starbird; Sports Committee, E. A. Starbird, N. S. Starbird and Omar Grover. Resolution Committee, Mrs. J. C. Starbird, Mrs. E. W. Brockway and Mrs. Hazel Sidelinger.

An invitation was extended and accepted that the Starbird Reunion be held with Mrs. Carroll Starbird at North Dexter in 1932 and she was appointed as Chairman of the Table Committee with the privilege of choosing her helpers. A rising vote of thanks was given Mr. and Mrs. Brockway for their hospitality and the meeting closed with all singing "God Be With You 'Till We Meet Again".
